


# FAST FACTS

### English Learners (ELs): Absenteeism, Retention, and Suspension

This fact sheet uses data from the 2013–14 Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC). CRDC is a survey of all public schools and school districts in the United States.

#### Percentages of ELs and Non-ELs Chronically Absent, All Grade Levels: SY 2013–14



#### **Fact**

In SY 2013–14, 11 percent of ELs were chronically absent (absent more than 15 or more school days during the school year) compared to 14 percent of non-ELs.


#### Percentages of ELs and Non-ELs Chronically Absent, By Grade Level: SY 2013-14

## Percentages of ELs and Non-ELs Chronically Absent in High School (Grades 9-12): SY 2013–14





In SY 2013–14, ELs were less likely to be chronically absent at every grade level except for high school.

#### Percentages of ELs and Non-ELs Enrolled and Retained in High School (Grades 9-12): SY 2013-14




#### **Fact**

In SY 2013-14, ELs represented 5 percent of all students enrolled—and 11 percent of those students "held back" or retained—in high schools nationwide.

### **Fact**

ELs are not disproportionately suspended from school.

In SY 2013–14, ELs represented 12 percent of students enrolled in public preschool and 10 percent of students enrolled in grades k-12, but only 7 percent of students receiving one or more out-of-school suspensions.
